I am going to the Andrew Carnegie Birthplace Museum.

There is lots for me to see at the Museum.

I can explore the cottage where Andrew Carnegie, a famous person from Dunfermline, was born. Some parts of the cottage are quite dark.

I go into the cottage through this door. There are 3 steps.



While I explore I can look for toy bunnies and count how many I can see. There are bunny toys in the cottage and the hall. When I leave I can tell the person at the desk how many I found and they will give me a sticker.



There is a room with a loom for weaving material. It is almost 200 years old! There are barriers so we do not touch the loom.



When I go in a song about weaving will start to play. If I don't like this I can ask a member of staff to turn it off.



I can then go upstairs. There are 15 steps to the top.



Upstairs is the Birthplace room. This is where Andrew Carnegie was born and where he lived when he was a child.



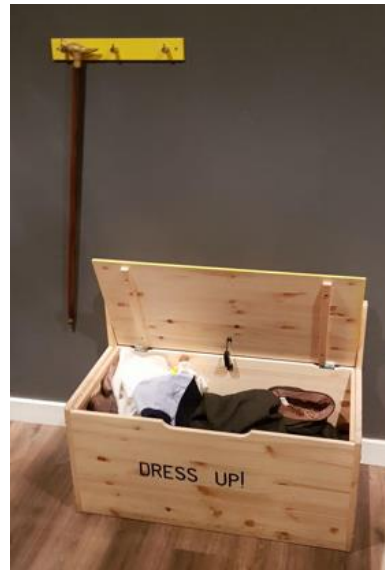
This room was their bedroom, kitchen, living room, study and dining room! There is a chamber pot under the bed which was the toilet.



If I press this button a sound recording telling me about the room will start.

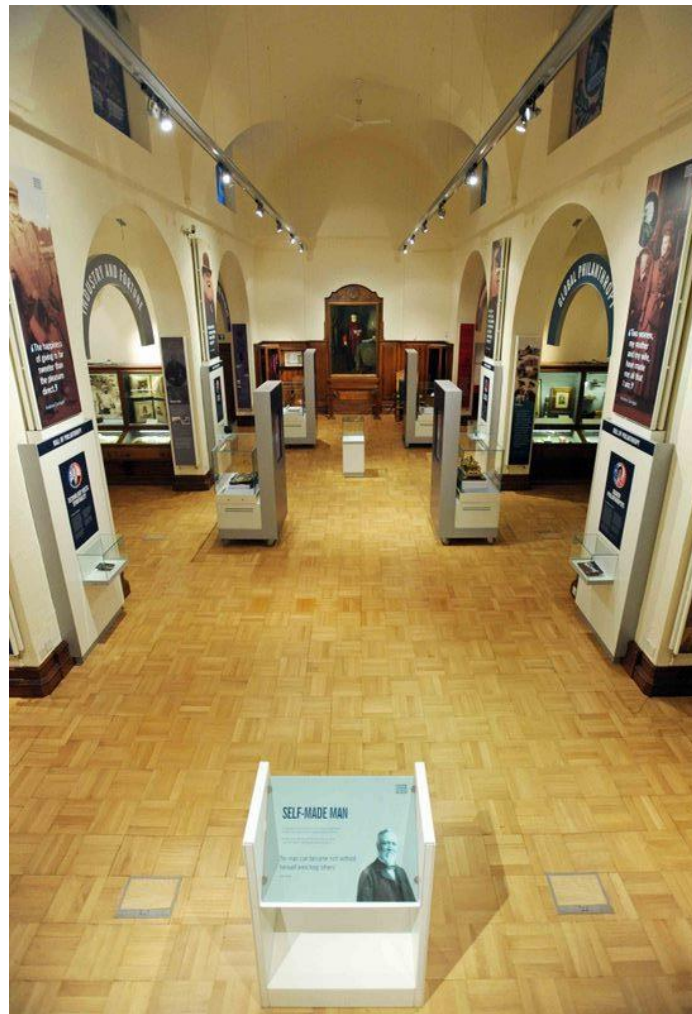
There are barriers in this room so I know where I can't go.

This is the Museum Hall.



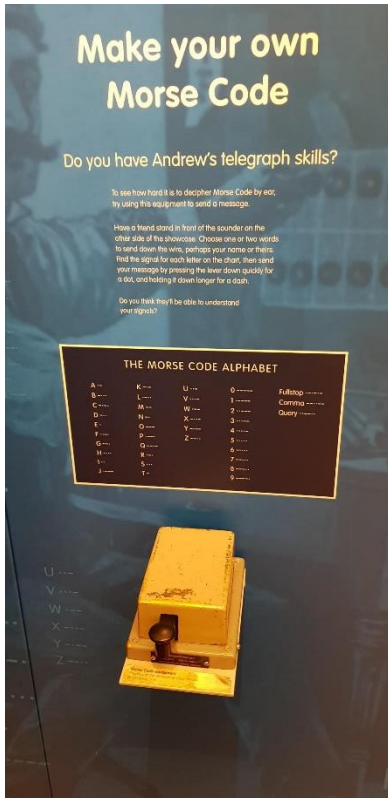
It has lots of things in it from a whale's tooth to Sesame Street puppets.
