Our museum is committed to providing an excellent and accessible service whilst minimising the environmental impact of our activities. As a visitor or local resident, you can help too! We invite you to consider these six points:

3) Consume Responsibly: We aim to offer low-impact, Fair Trade and locally sourced products in our shop and refreshments area.

Please help us reduce the amount of consumables usage by taking only what is necessary (for example, use fewer paper napkins, cups, maps/leaflets and carrier bags). Instead of buying bottled water, feel free to use our water refill station instead. If you bought one of our museum plastic bags, we encourage you to re-use it!

We offer recycling facilities on-site. Please read the instructions on your packaging and on our bins before disposing of your rubbish - throwing non-recyclable items in recycling bins will contaminate the whole contents of the bin which will result in everything being sent to landfill instead.
